**Resolution authorizing adoption of Local Law No. 3 of 2026, creating a new Chapter 77 of the Farmington Town Code entitled Bicycles with Electric Assist, Electric Scooters, Go-Karts, Golf Carts and Limited Use Motorcycles; and directing the filing with the New York State Department of State, Division of Corporations, State Records and Uniform Commercial Code**

**WHEREAS** the Farmington Town Board (hereinafter referred to as Town Board) has tonight conducted a public hearing on the proposed Local Law No. 3 of 2026, dated April 8, 2026, proposing the creation of a new Chapter 77 of the Farmington Town Code; and

**WHEREAS** the Town Board has given consideration to the testimony provided at tonight’s public hearing.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Town Board classifies the above referenced Action as being a Type II Action, under the provisions of 6NYCRR Part 617.5 (26) of article 8 of the New York State Environmental Conservation Law (ECL).

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** Type II Actions have been determined not to have a significant impact on the environment or are otherwise precluded from environmental review under the ECL.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** the Town Board hereby adopt the above referenced draft of Local Law No. 3 of 2026 (hereinafter referred to as Action).

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** the Town Clerk is directed to certify Local Law Number 3 of 2026, has been duly adopted on this date and to file said local law with the New York State Department of State, Division of Corporations, State Records and Uniform Commercial Code.

**RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE HIRING VILLAGER CONTRUCTION FOR  
MILLING AND PAVING FOR THE 2026  
284 AGREEMENT PROJECTS**

**WHEREAS**, the Town Board approved the Highway Superintendent’s 284 Agreement in Board Resolution #426-2025 on December 23, 2025. The Highway Superintendent has deemed Villager Construction as the best value for the Mill and Fill projects on Collett Road, Estate Drive, and Stonefield Lane; and

**WHEREAS**, the pricing by Villager Construction supplied to the Wayne County Request for Bids (BB26029) for 2026 lists the highway milling machine at \$5,000/day with a \$500 mobilization fee. The supplier Donegal that is listed in the Ontario County Bid Book for 2026 is by square yards and would exceed the Villager pricing; and

**WHEREAS**, Villager paver pricing at \$3,900/day which includes delivery is also a better value than the Ontario County Bid Book pricing; now therefore

**BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Town Board approves the Highway Superintendent hiring Villager Construction for the 2026 Mill and Fill projects as described in the 2026 284 Agreement; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Town Clerk forward copies of this Resolution to the Highway Superintendent and the Accountant I.
